## Psychoanalysis & The Arts

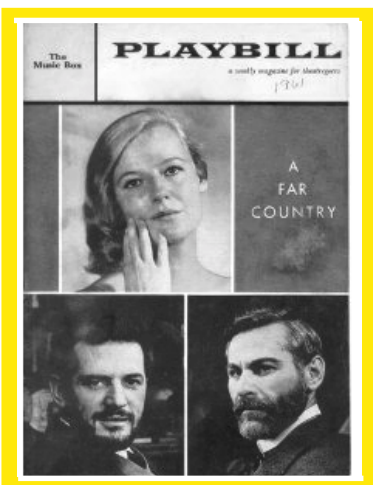
### A Far Country
